Location the activity will take place (e.g. geographical location or Latitude and Longitude):

Immediately upstream, downstream and between the two old Highway 7 Pitt River Bridges, West and East of the swing control tower. 49.248744 – 122.729322.

Hours of operation and start and end times/dates (eg. 8-5, Monday to Friday/daylight hours etc):

The demolition of both of the old Pitt River Bridges will continue. Barges will be either operating or moored in the area around the bridge piers 24 hrs/day, 7 days per week.

Description of activity taking place and any restrictions to the waterway (eg. closing a channel etc.):

Demolition of both the old north and south Pitt River bridges will be taking place. All areas except the specified marine navigation channels identified on the attached drawing are not safe for marine navigation due to a multiple hazard environment throughout the demolition period.

Some of the hazards within the restricted area will include barge operations, risks of possible falling objects, mooring and anchor cables, divers and submerged objects.

The restricted areas may change from time to time, so marine users are advised to regularly monitor for updated Notices to Shipping. Updated Notices will be issued at least weekly throughout the demolition.

Vessels participating or support vessels such as dredges, tugs, etc.(if applicable):

Multiple barges, small utility boats, and tugs may operate near each of the old bridges that are to be demolished.

VHF Channel to be monitored (if applicable):

Bridge control tower: Channel 74

Working channel: Channel 6

Special Requests and additional information (eg. minimum wash, clearance restrictions etc):

A no wake zone will be designated from 200 m upstream and downstream of the Pitt River bridges.
