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# NOTICE TO SHIPPING REQUEST

**Location the activity will take place (e.g. geographical location or Latitude and Longitude):**

West of the Existing Port Mann Bridge in Construction Zone 1, Zone 2 & Zone 3.

**Hours of operation and start and end times/dates (eg. 8-5, Monday to Friday/daylight hours etc):**

The D.B. Bremerton, and the No. 6 derrick, along with several support barges, will be moored on the border between Zone 2 and Zone 3, west of the main tower of the existing bridge. These barges will be operating 24 hours a day, for the entire week, starting September 28th, 2009.

The RE McKenzie derrick and two support barges will be moored in Zone 1. These barges will be operating Monday through Friday between the hours of 0600 and 1800.

The Peter D derrick and a support barge will be moored in Zone 1. These barges will be operating Monday through Friday between the hours of 0600 and 1800.

The Dredge Columbia and support derricks will be located in Construction Zone 2. These barges will be operating 24 hours a day, for the entire week, starting October 5th, 2009.

**Description of activity taking place and any restrictions to the waterway (eg. closing a channel etc.):**

The D.B. Bremerton will be positioned at the South side of the N1 footing for collar installation. The No. 6 derrick will be positioned on the North side of the N1 footing for excavation of pile at N1. This activity will restrict maneuverability of vessel traffic in the Main Navigational Passage.

The RE McKenzie derrick and two equipment barges will be moored North of Tree Island in Construction Zone 1. These barges will be installing the construction access trestle west of the existing Port Mann Bridge, on the North of Tree Island.

The Peter D Anderson derrick and an equipment barge will be moored in Construction Zone 1, adjacent to the Essondale Channel on the north side. These barges will be installing falsework and permanent pile for Pier N5 of the New Port Mann Bridge. This activity in combination with the RE McKenzie will close the Essondale Passage for the week starting October 5<sup>th</sup>, 24 hours a day, until the end of shift on Friday, October 7<sup>th</sup>.

The Dredge Columbia will be removing sand in Construction Zone 2 for barge access. This activity will close both the North and South Working Passages. A pipeline for the dredge material will also be positioned across the Essondale Channel which will restrict maneuverability of vessel traffic in the Essondale Channel from the bridge site to the Fraser Mill site approximately 3 km downstream.

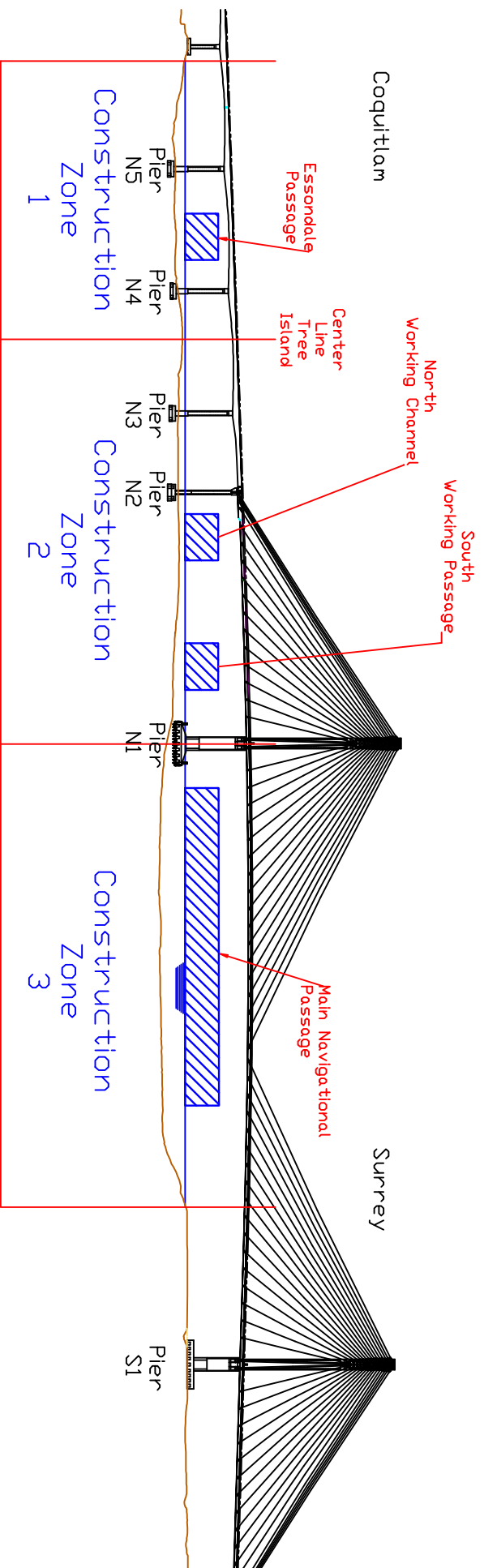
**Special Requests and additional information (eg. minimum wash, clearance restrictions etc):**

No wake zones will be designated 200 meter upstream and downstream of all marine construction vessels.

The Essondale Channel will be marked on the Trestle with Green and Red Lateral Lighting. It will be a 4 second flash pattern consisting of a .5 sec flash with 3.5 sec eclipse.

## **WARNING:**

**There are submerged hazards located on the North side of the Peter D Anderson barge. Temporary piles have been installed around them to keep vessels away from the hazard. Please be advised to stay clear of this area so as not to damage your vessels.**

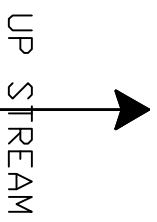
