Special Requests or Additional Information:

Anchor installed upstream of Pattullo S1 Pier for marine derrick positioning at Pier 6 and 7. Anchor coordinates are as follows: 49 12' 31.6"N, 122 53' 30.9" W.

As marine equipment will be positioned and working around Piers 6 through 10, this area will be restricted to navigation.

Reference is made to the attached staging drawings for the time period noted above for the marine scope of work. This is a general depiction of the marine equipment positions during working and non-working hours, and is subject to change based on site conditions.

A full time assist tug from Catherwood Towing will be on site until 1800 April 21 to aid vessels going through the navigational channel in the event of an emergency situation or as needed once tug operators have satisfied VFPA tug assist requirements as documented in the VFPA Port Information Guide on their own accord. NAV tug assistance will become available again when marine works resume within either the marine navigation channel or the administrative safety zones.
